

Registration Procedure

You can register Friday night or in the mornings. When you pick up your registration packet in the lobby, you will receive:

- A white envelope with:
 - Your name tag. Please wear it whenever at FIT. On it you'll find your priority numbers.
 - Stick-on labels with your name to attach to your Origami Collection, etc. Remember - everyone's everything looks just the same.
 - A ticket for the Origami Collections you have ordered, if any.
 - T-shirt tickets.
 - Letters regarding volunteer assignments, ticketing priority, etc.
 - Dinner tickets.
 - An Origami Convention 2010 button and pen.
 - Stick-on labels with the headings 'Please teach me ... ', and 'I'll teach you ... '. If you're interested in teaching or learning a specific model, fill out one of the labels and wear it.
- A folder in which you'll find:
 - Origami paper.
 - An attendee list.
 - A Convention 2011 suggestion form. Please complete it and return it before the end of the convention, or mail it to us soon after the convention.
 - A current Supplies List and order form.
 - An agenda for the Annual Meeting, which will be held on Saturday at 5:30 pm.
 - A reminder to 'Don't Get in Over Your Head.' Please read it - it describes the skills you need to attend certain classes.
 - Final schedules for Saturday, Sunday and Monday classes.

There will also be a table where you can exchange your ticket for the Origami Collection, if you want to take it immediately. If you'd prefer, you can pick it up later in the weekend from The Origami Source. *You must pick up your Origami Collection before 5pm Sunday.*

The Hospitality Area is in the Great Hall on the 1st floor, between buildings C and D. Please go immediately after you register to see the model menu, which contains samples of all the models to be taught. Use it to help you decide which classes you're interested in taking. Pick two or three for each time slot. That should be easy, since there are usually 30 or more classes offered at all times. Your number will be called when it's time for you to get your class tickets. Please be sure you know what classes you want before you get on the ticketing line! If you have questions about your skill level, check with someone at the Information Desk in the Hospitality Area.

Note that the Sales Areas are in the Lower Level under the Great Hall, and in various areas in and around the Katie Murphy Amphitheater. Check signs for access.

If you have any questions, come to the Information Area, or look for someone with a red ribbon (Board Member or Convention Committee) or blue ribbon (Convention Pro) on their badge.
